NOTES ON TODAY'S HYMNS

Hail, Thou Once Despised Jesus is a much-altered hymn bearing strong Wesleyan traits. The first stanza praises the One who suffered for us and "didst free salvation bring." This One was a "universal Savior" through whom "we find favor" and "life." Charles Wesley made liberal use of the words "free" and "universal." In stanza two this theme continues. Using the early Christian term, "Paschal Lamb," we find that "full atonement [has been] made." The "gate of heaven" is opened to all and there does not appear to be any restriction on who may enter as "reconciled are we with God" is an open-ended claim. Stanza three places Jesus on the "throne . . . in glory" where he is adored by "all the heavenly hosts . . . at thy Father's side." He is there as our intercessor and is preparing a place for us. The final, triumphal stanza begins with "Worship, honor, power, and blessing," echoing Revelation 4:11 and 5:12–13. The themes of salvation and atonement found throughout this hymn are derived from Rom 5:8–12 and Heb 8:1, 7:25.

IN BABILONE is a Dutch melody harmonized by T. Tertius Noble in 1918.

Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing is by Robert Robinson (1735–1790). Robinson uses the double rhyming of odd-numbered lines to great effect, and the hymn is rich in Biblical imagery. After a dissolute adolescence, Robinson was converted by the preaching of George Whitfield and became a Baptist minister.

NETTLETON first appeared in John Wyeth's *Repository of Sacred Music* (1813). It was named for Asahel Nettleton (1783–1844), a well-known evangelist.

Ye Servants of God was written by Charles Wesley in 1744, a year of political and religious turmoil in Britain. Newly formed Methodist societies were suspected of being merely disguised Roman Catholic societies and were accused of attempting to overthrow the Crown. To strengthen and reassure his Methodist followers, Wesley anonymously published *Hymns for Times of Trouble and Persecution* .which included this hymn, the first of the "Hymns to be Sung in a Tumult." The text is a hymn of thankful praise to Christ for his victorious reign and for providing salvation for his people.





THE ORDER OF HOLY BAPTISM FOR INFANTS

Priest, to the Parents and Godparents:

What do you desire of God's holy Church?

They answer: Baptism.

Will you take care, to the best of your ability, that this child be brought up as a faithful member of Christ's holy Church?

They answer: I will.

Let us pray:

Almighty and immortal God, the aid of all who need, the helper of all who flee to thee for succor, the life of those who believe, and the resurrection of the dead, we call upon thee for this child, that she, coming to thy holy Baptism, may receive remission of sin by spiritual regeneration, and being received into thy holy Church, may live steadfast in faith, joyful through hope, and rooted in charity. Receive her, O Lord, as thou hast promised by thy well-beloved Son, saying, Ask, and ye shall have; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you. So give now unto us who ask; let us who seek, find; open the gate unto us who knock; that this child may enjoy the everlasting benediction of thy heavenly washing, and may come to the eternal kingdom which thou hast promised by Christ our Lord. *All answer: Amen.*

Here the Priest shall ask the child's name of the godparents, and makes the sign of the cross upon the child's forehead:

We receive this child, *N*, into the congregation of Christ's flock; and do sign her with the sign of the Cross, in token that hereafter she shall not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified, and valiantly to fight under his banner, against sin, the world, and the devil; and to continue as Christ's faithful soldier and servant unto her life's end. *Amen.*

The Priest places a few grains of salt in the child's mouth:

Receive the salt of wisdom: may it be unto thee a pledge of everlasting life. Amen.

The Priest and the people pray together:

Almighty and everlasting God, heavenly Father, we give thee humble thanks, that thou hast vouchsafed to call us to the knowledge of thy grace, and faith in thee: Increase this knowledge, and confirm this faith in us evermore. Give the Holy Spirit to this child, that she may be born again, and be made an heir of everlasting salvation; through our Lord Jesus Christ, who liveth and reigneth with thee and the same Holy Spirit, now and for ever. *Amen.*

THE PROMISES

The Priest addresses the parents and godparents:

Dearly beloved, you have brought this child here to receive holy Baptism; you have prayed that our Lord Jesus Christ would vouchsafe to receive her, to release her from sin, to sanctify her with the Holy Spirit, to give her the kingdom of heaven, and everlasting life.

Do you therefore, in the name of this child, renounce the devil and all his works, the vain pomp and glory of the world, with all covetous desires of the same, and the sinful desires of the flesh, so that thou wilt not follow, nor be led by them?

They answer: I renounce them all; and, by God's help, will endeavor not to follow, nor be led by them.

The Priest here anoints the child with the Oil of the Catechumens, saying: I anoint thee with the oil of Salvation, in Christ Jesus our Lord, that thou mayest have eternal life.

The Priest again addresses the parents and godparents:

Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth? *They answer:* I do.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived of the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried; he descended into hell; the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence he shall come to judge the living and the dead?

They answer: I do.

Do you believe the Holy Ghost; the holy Catholic Church, the Communion of Saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting? *They answer:* I do.

Then shall the Priest say to the godparents:

Do you, in the name of this child, profess this faith? *They answer:* I do.

Do you, in the name of this child, seek Baptism in this faith? *They answer:* I do.

Do you, in the name of this child, acknowledge the duty to keep God's holy will and commandments, walking steadfastly in the Way of Christ?

They answer: I do.

Do you resolve to pray for this child, and take care that she may learn and do all these things? *They answer:* I do.

Then shall the Priest make the following supplications, and after each the people shall answer Amen:

O merciful God, grant that the old Adam in this child may be so buried, that the new man may be raised up. *Amen.*

O Lord of Hosts, before the might of whose presence the armies of evil are put to flight, deliver thy servant from the power of Satan. *Amen.*

Grant that all sinful desires may die in this child, and that all things belonging to the Spirit may live and grow in her. *Amen.*

Grant that she may have power and strength to have victory, and to triumph against the devil, the world, and the flesh. *Amen.*

Grant that whosoever is here dedicated to thee by our office and ministry may be endued with heavenly virtues, and everlastingly rewarded, through thy mercy, O blessed Lord God, who dost live, and govern all things, world without end. *Amen*.

THE BLESSING OF THE WATER

The Lord be with you.And with thy spirit.Lift up your hearts.We lift them up unto the Lord.Let us give thanks unto our Lord our God.It is meet and right so to do.

It is very meet, right, and our bounden duty, that we should at all times and in all places give thanks unto thee, O Lord, Holy Father, Almighty, Everlasting God, for that thy dearly beloved Son Jesus Christ, for the forgiveness of sins, did shed out of his most precious side both water and blood; and gave commandment to his disciples, that they should go teach all nations, and baptize them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Regard, we beseech thee, O Lord, Holy Father, with thy Beloved Son, the supplications of thy congregation, and send the Holy Spirit upon the water of this font.

Sanctify \square this Water to the mystical washing away of sin; and grant that this child, now to be baptized therein, may receive the fullness of thy grace, and ever remain in the number of thy faithful children; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom with thee, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and evermore. Amen.

THE BAPTISM

Then shall the Priest say to the godparents:

Name this child.

N., I baptize thee in the Name of the Father \clubsuit , and of the Son \clubsuit , and of the Holy Spirit \clubsuit .

Then shall the Priest anoint the baptized on the crown of the head with holy Chrism:

Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who hath regenerated thee by Water and the Holy Spirit, and hath given unto thee remission of sin, vouchsafe to anoint thee with the unction of his Holy Spirit, and bring thee to the inheritance of everlasting life. *Amen.*

Here shall the Priest place upon the child a white vesture:

We give this white vesture, for a token of the innocency bestowed upon thee, and for a sign whereby thou art admonished to give thyself to pureness of living, that after this transitory life, thou mayest be a partaker of the life everlasting. *Amen*.

Then shall the Priest give a candle lit from the Paschal Candle to one of the godparents:

Receive the Light of Christ, that when the bridegroom cometh thou mayest go forth with all the Saints to meet him; and see that thou keep the grace of thy Baptism. *Amen.*

Seeing now, dearly beloved brethren, that this child is regenerate, and grafted into the body of Christ's Church, let us give thanks unto Almighty God for these benefits; and with one accord make our prayers unto him, that this child may lead the rest of her life according to this beginning.

Then shall the Priest say this prayer of thanksgiving:

We yield thee hearty thanks, most merciful Father, that it hath pleased thee to regenerate this child with thy Holy Spirit, to receive her for thine own by adoption, and to incorporate her into thy holy Church. Grant, O Lord, that being buried with Christ by Baptism and made partaker of his death, she may also be made partaker of his Resurrection; so that serving thee here in newness of life, she may finally, with the rest of thy holy Church, inherit thine everlasting kingdom; through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

The faithful now return to their places, and the Mass continues with the Prayers of the People.

We do earnestly repent, and are heartily sorry for these our misdoings; the remembrance of them is grievous unto us, the burden of them is intolerable. Have mercy upon us, have mercy upon us, most merciful Father; for thy Son our Lord Jesus Christ's sake, forgive us all that is past; and grant that we may ever hereafter serve and please thee in newness of life, to the honor and glory of thy Name; Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.







Wherefore, O Lord, we thy servants, and thy holy people also, remembering the blessed passion of the same Christ thy Son our Lord, as also his resurrection from the dead, and his glorious ascension into heaven; do offer unto thine excellent majesty of thine own gifts and bounty, the pure victim, the holy victim, the immaculate victim, the holy Bread of eternal life, and the Chalice of everlasting salvation.

Vouchsafe to look upon them with a merciful and pleasant countenance: and to accept them even as thou didst vouchsafe to accept the gifts of thy servant Abel the Righteous, and the sacrifice of our patriarch Abraham: and the holy sacrifice, the immaculate victim, which thy high priest Melchisedech offered unto thee.

We humbly beseech thee, Almighty God, command these offerings to be brought by the hands of thy holy Angel to thine altar on high, in sight of thy divine majesty: that all we who at this partaking of the altar shall receive the most sacred Body and Blood of thy Son, may be fulfilled with all heavenly ***** benediction and grace.

By whom and with whom and in whom, to thee, O Father Almighty, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory throughout all ages, world without end.



Mount Calvary Catholic Church brings forward the fullness of the faith. The Mass is the supreme act of worship throughout the history of the Church, and we embrace all its symbolism and beauty to transform our world. We worship so as to lift up Christ in the beauty of holiness.

Where heaven and earth meet

Our worship awakens the senses and prepares the heart to receive our Lord. We enter into a holy realm and leave the commonplace behind. Holy water reminds us of our baptism. Incense prepares the way for the Lord's presence. Music lifts up our hearts in beauty and truth.

We bring forward a form of worship with ancient roots that stands the test of time. We *leave time behind* as heaven meets earth in mystery and the reality of our Lord's presence in the Eucharist.

Distinctive aspects of our worship

Incense. In the New Testament book of Revelation, incense represents the prayers of the saints. In the Old Testament, incense is used in the Temple sacrifice. From ancient times, incense sweetens the air to honor important visitors. Incense at Mass invokes all this symbolism. From the earliest days of the Church, incense has been used to prepare the altar and people for the presence of our Lord.

Sung prayers and readings. Music lifts up the heart and honors God. Singing elevates our Sunday worship as the most important thing that we do each week.

Kneeling and standing. As we worship with our bodies, our hearts become more fully engaged. The basic idea is this: kneel for prayer, sit for instruction, stand for praise.

The King's English. Some call this traditional English. While the language is traditional, it was never the common language of the street. Instead, it was the most exalted and beautiful language in England at the time the liturgy was developed: The King's English. The intent was that nothing less should be used in worship of our God. This language continues to be more poetic and easier to remember than street English. While there are occasions to address God more informally, this language in worship helps us to step out of the realm of the commonplace in order lift up our hearts to our Heavenly King.

The priest facing the altar. The priest faces the people when addressing the people and he faces the altar when addressing God. This approach helps to keep our focus on God when our prayers are addressed to him. This is the way priests have said Mass throughout most of Church history.
