

NOTES ON TODAY'S HYMNS

The Church's One Foundation was written by Samuel John Stone (1839-1900) as an expansion of the article in the Creed: "The Holy Catholic Church, the Communion of saints." Bishop Colenso of South Africa had denounced most of the Bible as fictitious; in response Stone wrote this affirmation of the Church, which, although afflicted by heresies and schisms, still reflects the unity of the Trinity and the glory of the Church Triumphant in heaven.

The tune AURELIA is by Samuel Sebastian Wesley (1810–1876), the son of the composer Samuel Wesley, and grandson of Methodist hymnwriter Charles Wesley.

O Jesus, I Have Promised is by John Ernest Bode (1816-1874). Born in London, Bode was educated at both Eton and Charterhouse, as well as Christ Church, Oxford. His service as a Fellow of Christ Church included taking Holy Orders as deacon in 1841 and priest, 1843. Bode served as a vicar at Westwell, Oxfordshire and Castle Camps, Cambridgeshire.

This hymn has its origins in the confirmation of the poet's daughter and two sons in 1866. It immediately became a favorite for confirmations, and Percy Dearmer wrote, "Bishops have been known to implore their clergy that this hymn should not be sung at all the Confirmations they attend."

Spread, O Spread, Thou Mighty Word was written by Jonathan Friedrich Bahnmaier. It was translated into English by Catherine Winkworth, well known for her English translations of German hymns, and first appeared in her *Lyra Germanica* in 1855. Her translations are polished and yet remain close to the original. A pioneer in promoting women's rights, Winkworth put much of her energy into the encouragement of higher education for women.

LÜBECK, or GOTT SEI DANK was composed by Johann Freylinghausen, and first appeared in his *Geistreiches Gesang Buch* in 1704. At his death in 1739, he was priest of St. Ulrich and director of the orphanages and boarding schools.





Joshua 24:1-2a, 15-17, 18b

Then the people answered, "Far be it from us that we should forsake the LORD, to serve other gods; for it is the LORD our God who brought us and our fathers up from the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage, and who did those great signs in our sight, and preserved us in all the way that we went, and among all the peoples through whom we passed; therefore we also will serve the LORD, for he is our God."

The Second Lesson Ephesians 5:21-32

Be subject to one another out of reverence for Christ. Wives, be subject to your husbands, as to the Lord. For the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the Church, his body, and is himself its Savior. As the Church is subject to Christ, so let wives also be subject in everything to their husbands.

Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the Church and gave himself up for her, that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, that he might present the Church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. Even so husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. For no man ever hates his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, as Christ does the Church, because we are members of his body.

"For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and he joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh."

This is a great mystery, and I mean in reference to Christ and the Church.

After this many of his disciples drew back and no longer walked with him. Jesus said to the Twelve, "Will you also go away?"


Simon Peter answered him, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life; and we have believed, and have come to know, that you are the Holy One of God."






TAKE THIS, ALL OF YOU, AND EAT OF IT:

By whom and with whom and in whom, to thee, O Father Almighty, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory throughout all ages, world without end.


