NOTES ON TODAY'S HYMNS

Awake, My Soul, Stretch Every Nerve was written by Philip Doddridge. Doddridge wrote some four hundred hymn texts, generally to accompany his sermons. These hymns were published posthumously in *Hymns, Founded on Various Texts in the Holy Scriptures* (1755).

The tune Christmas is based on the beginning of the soprano aria *Non vi piacque ingiusti dei* from the opera *Siroe* by G.F. Handel.

O Master, Let Me Walk With Thee was written by Washington Gladden in 1879.

MARYTON was composed by Henry Percy Smith in 1874. Smith was born in Malta and ordained a priest in the Church of England in 1850. The tune was originally published in Arthur S. Sullivan's *Church Hymns with Tunes*. MARYTON is his only tune found in contemporary hymnals and is thought to be the only tune he published.

Ye Servants of God was written by Charles Wesley in 1744, a year of political and religious turmoil in Britain. Newly formed Methodist societies were suspected of being merely disguised Roman Catholic societies and were accused of attempting to overthrow the Crown. To strengthen and reassure his Methodist followers, Wesley anonymously published *Hymns for Times of Trouble and Persecution* which included this hymn, the first of the "Hymns to be Sung in a Tumult." The text is a hymn of thankful praise to Christ for his victorious reign and for providing salvation for his people.

By whom and with whom and in whom, to thee, O Father Almighty, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory throughout all ages, world without end.






